Happily, the future looks a lot brighter than when I last put pen to paper for Cascade 12 months ago. The roll-out of the vaccination programme and the relative mildness of the Omicron strain has led to sharply reduced numbers of serious illnesses and hospitalisations.

As I write, this in turn has led the government to remove almost all the Covid restrictions.

So, at last, we can return to normal social activity if we choose to do so. Also, we will hopefully see inroads being made into the backlog of medical treatment and an end to the disruption of children's education.

The Federation Committee (FC) meets in January and July each year and has the following responsibilities:

- To agree the equitable distribution of the annual grant provided by AXA UK between the six Associations
- To monitor the financial health of each Association
- To produce the magazine Cascade

- To monitor the service being provided by the Pensions Scheme administrator
- To consider any other matters that could impact on pensioners.

The FC held 'virtual' meetings last July and in January this year. Discussions covered all of the above topics. The distribution of the annual grant was confirmed to AXA. The timetable for the production of Cascade 2022 was agreed. Association Chairmen confirmed satisfaction with the service from Capita, the Pension Scheme administrator.

Each of the Pensioner Associations uses its annual grant to pursue activities for the welfare of its pensioners.

These activities include:

- Keeping in touch with their pensioners about matters of interest and sources for advice and support
- Arranging conferences, coffee mornings, lunches etc. where their pensioners can meet former colleagues.
- Some Associations give modest gifts to pensioners on, for example, significant birthdays.

The pandemic has disrupted such activities over the last two years and so discussion at both of the above meetings centred around sharing plans to increase activities over the coming years. One thing that the pandemic highlighted was the importance of human contact for elderly people and so increased activities in the second category will be pursued wherever there is a demand and it is practical for us to do so.

Rebecca Shevill, Head of Pensions Administration and Trustee Services, will be retiring after 12 years' service with AXA UK. Rebecca has been the link between members of the FC and the Company. She has been enormously supportive of and helpful to the FC over the years and we will all miss her cheerful and constructive input to our meetings and individual help with pensioner problems. We all wish her a very long, happy and fulfilling retirement.

I hope that you enjoy this latest edition of Cascade and please do let your Association Chairman know if you have comments or suggestions about content or style. We are committed to ensuring that the magazine continues to be a useful, enjoyable and wanted magazine.




It was well attended this year and we were treated to an excellent meal with wine and recounted stories of days gone by and the people we knew and had worked with.

When a Scheme pensioner dies, please notify Capita on 0114 273 7331.

A death must be registered with the local Register Office within five days unless the death has been reported to the coroner. Most Register Offices now offer the 'Tell us once' service which notifies government departments and agencies including DWP, HMRC, DVLA and the Passport Office in one contact.

AgeUK publishes a very useful guide called 'When someone dies', which you can download from their website or order by phoning their helpline (see page 44).

Making a will

If you have not already done so, it is very important that you give the matter serious consideration. Sources of information are AgeUK, Independent Age and Citizens Advice (see page 44).

In later years, it could be wise to consider granting Power of Attorney, and the above three organisations all offer help.


Progress on GMP Equalisation

In 2018 a High Court judgment ruled that pension schemes are required to equalise the Guaranteed Minimum Pensions (GMP) for men and women, which were built up on or after 17 May 1990. The Trustee of the AXA UK Group Pension Scheme ('Trustee') are aware of this ruling and are currently working with their advisors to consider how to proceed with this complicated area of legislation.

If your GMP was wholly accrued prior to 17 May 1990 (as you ceased working for AXA or another Company before this date), you will not be impacted by the recent High Court judgment.

If some or all of your GMP was accrued on or after 17 May 1990, then you may be impacted by the recent High Court judgment. In the event that it is subsequently determined that an adjustment is required, a small further benefit may be due to you.

If you are affected by GMP Equalisation, the Trustee will contact you in due course to explain any rights and options you might have. This is likely to be in 2023.
